Pre-School Program

Requirements for Enrollment:

1. Must be four years of age by September 1st
2. Immunization record
3. Birth certificate
4. Social Security Number
5. Proof of residence

Expectations for Child Behavior:

- Children will be expected to follow age appropriate classroom rules.
- Children must be potty trained and be able to take care of toileting needs.
- Children will be expected to obey the teacher.
- Children will be expected to participate in small and large group activities.
- Children will not exhibit aggressive behavior such as hitting or biting.
- Children will be expected to arrive on time and have good attendance.

Class begins at 8:20, students should not arrive to class before 8:05. Class ends at 3:15. Car riders will be picked up in the car line in front of main office. Each student will be walked to the car by a teacher.

Once a week we will go to Library. Pre-k will not check out books from the school Library. I will have books for students to check out from the pre-school classroom Library.

We will have a rest time after lunch recess. You may bring mats, sleeping bags, blankets, pillows, and one stuffed animal.

We will have a morning snack. Please send snacks once a month at a convenient time for you, enough snacks for each student.
